

18.05.21 – Marriage Tax Allowance

Are you claiming your marriage tax allowance? You could save up to £252* in this tax year (and the claim can be backdated to include any tax year since April 2017 that you were eligible).

You are entitled to claim tax relief if:

- You are married or in a civil partnership
- One partner does not pay tax or earns under the personal allowance (£12,570 for 2021-22 tax year*)
- The other partner is a basic rate tax payer (usually means their income is between £12,501 and £50,270* before they receive Marriage Tax allowance.

It works by transferring 10% of the non-taxpayer's personal allowance to the basic rate tax payer, resulting in the basic rate tax payer paying less tax.
